## HLF receives \$14K boost from Tiger Jeet Singh Foundation

The Halton Learning Foundation

(HLF) received \$14,000 from the foundation Feb. 10 at Troy's Diner.

The funds will be directed to four elementary and two high schools

in Milton to support initiatives such as literacy and breakfast programs, inclusive classrooms and mental health projects.

Tiger Jeet Singh Jr. and staff from HLF jointly presented cheques to school representatives at a reception hosted by Singh Jr., president of the Tiger Jeet Singh Foundation. HLF helps support quality education for Halton District School Board students by providing emergency

help and subsidies for students in need, post-secondary scholarships, and funds to assist schools that have classroom needs beyond core education funding.

Singh Jr. said the foundation jumped to help HLF when it discovered all that the non-profit group does to help local schools.

"This is also to give awareness to where the funds are going — to literacy, to mental health," he said.

"We live in a wonderful town, but as we know funding falls short sometimes.

"We hope to fill the void," Singh Jr. said, adding it's a pleasure to be an ambassador for HLF.

HLF's executive director Lesley Mansfield said she's pleased to partner with the Tiger Jeet Singh Foundation.

"Together, we are working to ensure financial barriers to education

are removed for students in the Halton District School Board," she said. "With one in 10 children living at or below the poverty line in Halton, these funds will help keep them engaged at school, focused on their studies but more importantly, make them feel like part of the community."

Schools receiving funds include Tiger Jeet Singh School, where they'll be used to augment and ex-
